

PE and Sport Premium at Ringway Primary School

Starting in 2013 primary schools will receive a share of over £450 million to improve physical education (PE) and sport. Ringway have received £8395 in the academic year 2013/14, £9005 for 2014/15 and of £9043.00 for 2015/16. The government have extended this plan and in 2016/17 the school received £9220 towards sport and PE.

Schools can choose how they use the funding, for example to:

- hire specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers during PE lessons
- support and involve the least active children by running after-school sports clubs and holiday clubs,
- provide resources and training courses in PE and sport for teachers
- run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the School Games
- run sports activities with other schools

Accountability

Since September 2013, Ofsted inspections report on PE and sport provision and on how schools spend their additional funding.

Schools are required to publish on their websites, details of how they spend (or will spend) their PE and sport grant.

At Ringway, we have decided to use our entire allocation to pay towards:

- Hiring specialist coaching from **Shooting Stars**
 - Two specialist Shooting Stars coaches work in school during lunchtimes. Each year group (years 1 to 6) has a weekly timetabled session.
 - On Wednesday and Thursday afternoons, the six classes in years 2 to 4 each have a 50-minute session during curriculum time with the specialist Shooting Stars coaches.

The specialist coaching from **Shooting Stars** at lunchtimes has increased the number of children engaged in structured sports – the coaches have worked with the children to develop their physical skills, sporting values, tactical awareness, leadership skills, fitness levels and there have been fewer recorded incidents in the lunchtime behaviour log.

By working alongside the **Shooting Stars** coaches, class teachers have had an opportunity to develop their coaching abilities. This will have an ongoing positive impact on the quality of sporting provision at teaching at Ringway.
