- Describe position, direction and movements, including half, quarter and three-quarter turns.



Year 1 Programme of Study

Number

- Count to and across 100 forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number.
- Count read and write numbers to 100 in numerals, count in different multiples including 1s, 2s, 5s & 10s
- Identify 1 more and 1 less than any number
- Use language equal to, more than, less than, most, least
- Read and write numbers to 20 in numbers and words.

Addition & Subtraction

- ◆ Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equal (=) signs
- ◆ Represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20
- ◆ Add and subtract 1-digit and 2-digit numbers to 20
- ◆ Solve simple one-step problems that involve addition and subtraction, using concrete objects and pictorial representations, and missing number problems.

Multiplication & Division

- ◆ Solve simple one-step problems involving multiplication and division, calculating the answer using concrete objects and pictorial representations, and arrays with the support of the teacher.

Fractions

- ◆ Recognise, find and name a half as one of two equal parts.
- ◆ Recognise, find and name a quarter as one of four equal parts.

Measure

- ◆ Compare, describe and solve practical problems for
- ◆ Length & height
- ◆ Mass or weight
- ◆ Capacity & volume
- ◆ Time
- ◆ Recognise and know the values of different denominations of coins and notes
- ◆ Sequence events in chronological order using language such as: before and after, next, first, today, yesterday, tomorrow, morning, afternoon and evening.

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
