

British Values

At Ringway Primary School we have looked carefully at British Values and decided that a really effective way to deliver those values would be to become a Rights Respecting School and follow the UNICEF strategy to teach children all the core values of rights, responsibility and respect.

The other great support for this subject is our *Go Givers* membership - we are able to use a range of work to deliver the core tenets of democracy, rule of law, tolerance & respect by following this programme .

Democracy

We hold an annual democracy day where every pupil gets a vote from Y 1-6

We have an active school council who meet at least half-termly- these are elected by their class.

We have Pupil voice assemblies , where issues may be voted on or quick surveys done.

We have an annual pupil survey and share results with the school community.

Our school council meet the governors annually.

We regularly visit different places of worship & have visitors in from different faiths.

We raise money for our global neighbours, Children in Need, Macmillan coffee mornings, UNICEF & a local Domestic Violence refuge.

We visit local old people in the Autumn Leaves project and at Christmas.

At Harvest time we collect for our local food bank.

Individual learning
